Today we are delighted to welcome our guest speaker, **Christobel Hutchings** who will be talking to us about the **history of Newport Museum and Art Gallery**. Christobel is the Chair of Friends of Newport Museum and Art Gallery. She has taught history at Croesyceiliog and then at Coleg Gwent. Since retiring she has written articles and published two books and spends her time on committees that foster the work of Museums and Art Galleries.

This is a contrast to last month's meeting when our speakers were **Amy Brunnock and Karen Newman** from the Health Board's **Communication and Engagement Team.** They described how the team go out into the local community to gain their views on health services in the area but also provide lots of information on how the general public can access appropriate services. This was a lively session which prompted many questions from members. The team meets with the Health Board's Chief Executive on a weekly basis to provide feedback. We pleased that we are on target to meet our goal of £500 by next month through your donations, Christmas lunch, cake stalls etc. You will remember that last year the chosen charity was **Wales Air Ambulance**.

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Risk Assessments

We are required by Head Office to undertake a Risk Assessment each year to determine if there are any health and safety risks to members. This was discussed at the Committee meeting and fortunately for our Branch we have not identified too many risks. Risks could include any heavy lifting which should not be necessary for us. Overcrowding could be an issue so we would ask members to ensure that walkways are not blocked and to minimise risks of trips and slips. One area that we did identify was the need to have an emergency contact number for members particularly for those going on trips.

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New Breast Care Unit has opened

The brand new Breast Care Unit in Ysbyty Ystrad Fawr opened its doors to patients for the very first time at the beginning of the month.

Following an £11m investment from Welsh Government, the new unit has brought together clinical teams from Nevill Hall and the Royal Gwent Hospitals to provide an enhanced, more resilient and more effective breast service to better meet the needs of the Gwent population. The incredible fundraising efforts of local communities have also secured more than £260,000 in additional funding to ensure the unit has a less clinical, more homely feel. The funds raised have enabled the teams to purchase decorative items to improve the unit's environment, including artwork, furniture and feature lighting.

Hope 4U

We thought that it would be worth mentioning this charity as you may have friends or family members that might benefit from this scheme. The charity provides financial advice and support in pregnancy and for new parents. Recently, Hope 4U were delighted to be funded by National Grid to provide much needed support to expectant and new parents within the Aneurin Bevan University Health Board catchment area. As budgets are stretched further, more individuals are finding it harder to keep warm, buy food and pay their bills.

National Grid generously supplied 'Warm Packs 'to distribute to people in the hospital who are struggling and vulnerable. The packs included essentials such as hat, gloves, flask, socks, wind up torch and important literature clearly explaining what to do in an emergency and the Priority Services Register.

The service is to continue supporting expectant and new parents, working alongside NHS staff who are incredibly supportive of the service.
