Our work with Pharmacies

The Gwent Carers Strategic Partnership initiative
The Small Grant Scheme (SGS)
was developed to support life alongside caring.

The scheme is delivered by Carers Trust South East Wales and was introduced to reflect a gap in provision of financial support that was available and to help support carers alongside their caring role, enabling carers to request financial assistance under specific categories.

Small Grant Scheme

A total of 461 applications were considered by the panel in 2020/21 of which 364 were successful.

Outcomes reported include

- Improved resilience;
- Reduced isolation;
- Improved financial situation;
- More time for themselves/family;
- Improved health and wellbeing;
- Increased confidence

This year saw a huge increase in demand with an average of £11,000 per month being allocated.






















Aneurin Bevan University Health Board Gwent Carers Strategic Partnership
