



# Community Hospitals

The way that we provide healthcare in Gwent is changing

Our Community Hospitals will continue to provide first class care to the residents of Gwent. These hospitals are in the heart of our communities and help us deliver a wide range of care to patients closer to home.

You may also visit these hospitals to attend outpatients appointments and clinics.



**Ysbyty Aneurin Bevan**, in Ebbw Vale, has 80 rehabilitation beds, X-Ray facilities, an outpatients department, mental health facilities, therapies services, and a first class midwife-led birthing suite.

Ysbyty Aneurin Bevan also has a Minor Injury Unit.

**Chepstow Community Hospital** has 32 rehabilitation beds, X-Ray facilities, two GP surgeries, a therapies area, outpatients department.

**St Woolos Hospital**, in Newport, has orthopaedic and dermatology wards, X-Ray facilities, rehabilitation wards, mental health facilities, and an outpatients department.

**County Hospital**, in Pontypool, has 44 rehabilitation beds, X-Ray facilities, an outpatients department, mental health facilities, and outpatient physiotherapy.

**Monnow Vale Health & Social Care Centre**, in Monmouth, offers mental health assessment and outpatients appointments for older adults. There are also 19 rehabilitation beds and a GP surgery at the hospital.

**Rhymney Integrated Health & Social Care Centre** has two GP practices, mental health facilities, therapy services and a small number of rehabilitation beds.

not immediately life-threatening.



**CALL NHS 111**  
if you are unwell, unsure what to do and need help.  
You can also call 111 for urgent GP care  
when your own Surgery is closed.



**TREAT AT HOME or CONTACT YOUR PHARMACIST**  
if you have a minor illness or ailment such as a  
sore throat, cough, skin irritation or common mild illness.
