



# Grange University Hospital

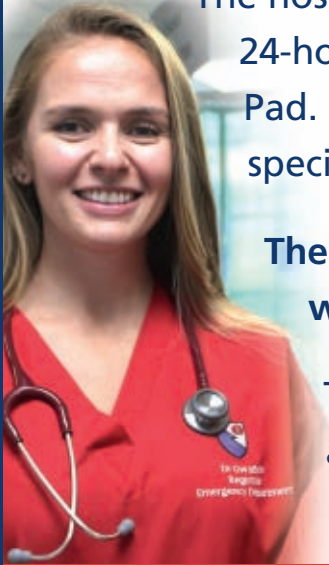
The way that we provide healthcare in Gwent is changing

Our new specialist and critical care centre, The Grange University Hospital – will provide a centre of excellence in Gwent to treat our most seriously ill patients or those with significant injuries and it will be the designated trauma unit for Gwent.

The hospital will have 560 beds (including trolleys and cots) and feature a 24-hour Acute Assessment Unit, Emergency Department and Helicopter Pad. It will provide a 24/7 emergency service for patients that need specialist and critical care.

**The hospital will open on 17th November 2020 to help us respond to winter pressures and a potential second wave of Covid-19.**

The Grange University Hospital will provide care for people who are seriously ill or have complex problems or conditions that cannot safely be managed in one of our Local General Hospitals.



The following services will be available at The Grange University Hospital:

- Emergency admissions for major illnesses and injuries and those in need of resuscitation;
- Emergency Surgery and Trauma care
- Major and Co-morbidity (more than one serious condition) Surgery
- Emergency Assessment Unit
- Critical Care
- Acute Cardiac Unit
- Cardiology Inpatients
- Hyper Acute Stroke Unit
- Acute Medicine
- Obstetric inpatients and high-risk births
- Children's Assessment Unit
- Neonatal Intensive Care and Special Care Baby Unit
- Paediatric inpatients
- Paediatric inpatient surgery
- Diagnostics
- Emergency endoscopy



## Getting you the right care

In an emergency, patients who need to be treated by a specialist team will go directly to The Grange University Hospital, where the highest levels of care and diagnostic support will be available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Some patients referred by their GP will be able to be treated closer to home in your local hospital. If your health deteriorates whilst you are being treated at any of our hospitals and you need access to the specialists or critical care provided at The Grange University Hospital, we will transfer you there via our dedicated patient transport service.

## Caring for Children

Children who require emergency treatment will go to The Grange University Hospital where specialist children's doctors and nurses will be centralised.

All children's hospital beds and the **Children's Emergency Assessment Unit** will also be at The Grange University Hospital.

The Royal Gwent Hospital, Nevill Hall Hospital and Ysbyty Ystrad Fawr will continue to provide a wide range of routine outpatient appointments for children and certain elective day case surgeries.

Local **Minor Injury Units** for children (aged over 1 year) will remain at The Royal Gwent Hospital, Nevill Hall Hospital, Ysbyty Ystrad Fawr and Ysbyty Aneurin Bevan. All children aged under 1 year old will be seen at The Grange University Hospital.

## Maternity Services

Antenatal clinics, midwifery-led routine deliveries and postnatal clinics will take place at The Royal Gwent Hospital, Nevill Hall Hospital and Ysbyty Ystrad Fawr. All Consultant led births will take place at The Grange University Hospital, with an additional centre for Midwifery-led births.
