





Firstly - A Reminder about Clinical Futures

Clinical Futures is the Health Board's plan for sustainable health and care services across the Gwent area and also for services we provide for the people of South Powys.



Our aim is to provide safe, high quality care and deliver as much of this at home, or as close to home as possible and also through our network of hospital and community based services and care.

As a Health Board, we also aim to improve the health and wellbeing of the population we serve, reduce health inequalities, and ensure the sustainability of our NHS health care system.

We have already made some major changes to the way we deliver our services - and you may have already seen that we have been delivering health care different ways or in one of our new facilities or in the community. We have moved a number of services

closer to where people live and we will continue to change the way we deliver our services, making sure that patients and service users are at the centre of everything we do and every decision we make.

The opening of The Grange University Hospital is a significant element in our Clinical Futures Service Programme and will be the catalyst for a series of other changes in our hospital system across Gwent from mid-November this year.

What the Clinical Futures Changes will mean for Nevill Hall Hospital



On Thursday the 8th of October we held a live question and answer session on our Facebook page to talk about the future services at Nevill Hall Hospital once The Grange University Hospital opens on the 17th November. The live event received a total reach of 68,000 and 8,427 engagements (comments, likes and shares). This session outlined that Nevill Hall Hospital will continue to provide first-class care to the residents of Gwent and South Powys, when The Grange University Hospital opens.

Nevill Hall will provide a wide range of services and will focus on delivering general and routine care.

These will include:

- day surgery surgery where you are operated on and discharged on the same day
- rehabilitation and therapy services services like physiotherapy and speech and language
- diagnostic services assessments, scans and x-rays needed for investigations including MRI and CT scans
- a Medical Assessment Unit
- a 24/7 nurse-led Minor Injury Unit
- Cancer services, with future plans for satellite Radiotherapy
- a wide variety of specialist outpatient clinics
- Frailty Care for older people
- 213 inpatient beds
- children's outpatient appointments
- antenatal and postnatal care and a midwife led birthing suite
