Weekly Progress (12 - 19 April)



We have now given a total of **439,533** vaccines (a combination of 1st and 2nd doses) across our Health Board area. We have now vaccinated over 70% of those aged 40-49, and those aged 35-39 will start to receive their invitation letter in the coming weeks.

For those aged 29 years and under who are not in a clinical risk group, the JCVI has amended their guidance, which now states that this cohort should be offered an alternative to the AstraZeneca COVID-19 vaccine, if available.

You will be made aware of which vaccine you will receive at your appointment and will have the opportunity to discuss any concerns you have with the staff at our Vaccination Centers. Our vaccination staff are also there to listen and help you if you have any phobias about needles.


Total number of Covid-19 vaccines given across our Health Board area (combination of 1st and 2nd doses)

Age 65-69 years







Reserve lists

You may have seen other Health Boards across Wales that have introduced a reserve list for their vaccine rollout.

At Aneurin Bevan University Health Board, we are vaccinating our population in line with JCVI guidance. We are inviting those eligible to receive the vaccine via letter or via the GP practice they are registered. We have a process in place where our vaccination booking centre will ring people who are eligible if we have appointments that become available on the day. We have an online form for people to complete if they haven't received their invite letter to ensure no one within the specific age cohort we are working through is missed. Other Health Boards across Wales may have a different process for inviting their population for their vaccine dependent on how their vaccination programme is progressing, however at Aneurin Bevan University Health Board we can assure the public that our booking process is currently working well, it is reviewed weekly and we do not feel a need to change our process at this time.
