## We have now given a total of 605,321 vaccines

(a combination of 1st and 2nd doses) across our Health Board area. Everyone over the age of 18 years who lives within the Aneurin Bevan Health Board area should now have received an invite for their first vaccination appointment.

#### **Vaccine Certificates for International Travel**



The Welsh Government are still advising against non-essential international travel. From 24th May, fully vaccinated people who need to travel for essential reasons can apply for a vaccine certificate.

You should only request a certificate if you're travelling in the next 4 weeks.

Not all countries will ask for a vaccine certificate, so please check entry requirements for the country you're travelling to.

If you received your 1st dose of Pfizer between 7th December 2020 – 31st March 2021 and not yet received your invite for your second vaccine, please complete the following form on our website:

If you received your 1st dose of AstraZeneca at a Mass Vaccination Centre between the dates of 4th January 2021 – 31st March 2021 and not yet received an invite for your 2nd dose, please complete the following form on our website: https://abuhb.nhs.wales/coronavirus/covid-19-vaccine/overdue-astrazeneca-second-dose/

If you received your first dose of AstraZeneca vaccine at your GP practice, they will be in contact directly to arrange your second dose.
