Weekly Progress (14 - 21 June)



We have now vaccinated 87% of the Health Board adult population with first doses offered to everyone aged 18 years and over.

We are also progressing well with second doses with 91% of over 50s being fully vaccinated.

Not leaving anybody behind...

On Saturday 26th June we will be holding walk-in vaccination clinics at our Mass Vaccination Clinics at both Newport Centre and Ebbw Vale. This walk-in clinic is for first doses only and is open to anyone aged 18 years and above as both Pfizer and AstraZeneca will be available. No appointment is necessary, however you will need to bring ID.

Level of protection against Delta variant

According to the latest PHW data, the 1st dose of Covid vaccine provides an estimated 25-36% protection against the Delta variant, protecting against symptomatic disease. The 2nd dose raises the level of protection up to 77-82%. Therefore it is important that you receive both doses of the Covid vaccination for maximum protection.

We are currently vaccinating those aged 40-49 years with their 2nd dose and those aged 30-39 years will start to receive their 2nd dose invite over the next few weeks.

If you received your 1st dose of Pfizer between 7th December 2020 – 30th April 2021 and not yet received your invite for your second vaccine, please complete the following form on our website: https://abuhb.nhs.wales/coronavirus/covid-19-vaccine/overdue-pfizer-second-dose/

If you received your 1st dose of AstraZeneca at a Mass Vaccination Centre between the dates of 4th January 2021 – 30th April 2021 and not yet received an invite for your 2nd dose, please complete the following form on our website: https://abuhb.nhs.wales/coronavirus/covid-19-vaccine/overdue-astrazeneca-second-dose/

If you received your first dose of AstraZeneca vaccine at your GP practice, they will be in contact directly to arrange your second dose.
