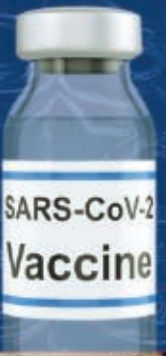

Weekly Progress (21 - 28 June)



We have now vaccinated 87% of the Health Board adult population with first doses offered to everyone aged 18 years and over.

We are also progressing well with second doses with 74% of 40-49 year olds being fully vaccinated.

Not leaving anybody behind...

The walk-in sessions on Saturday 26th June were extremely successful with 519 people attending Newport and 287 attending Ebbw Vale. Due to the success of these sessions, we are holding additional walk-in sessions on Saturday 3rd July at both Newport Leisure Centre and Newbridge Leisure Centre.

The walk-in clinics are for first doses only and are open to anyone aged 18 years and above as both Pfizer and AstraZeneca will be available.

No appointment is necessary, however you will need to bring ID.

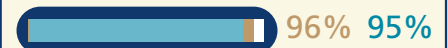
Total number of Covid-19 vaccines given across our Health Board area (combination of 1st and 2nd doses)

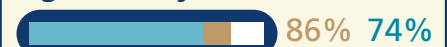

Second doses...

The 1st dose of Covid vaccine provides estimated 25-36% protection against the Delta variant, protecting against being symptomatic. The 2nd dose raises the level of protection up to 77-82%. Therefore it is important that you receive both doses of the Covid vaccination for maximum protection.

We are currently vaccinating those aged 35-39 years with their 2nd dose and those aged 30-34 years will start to receive their 2nd dose invite over the next few weeks.

Anybody over the age of 40 years will have an 8 week interval between their vaccines.

If you received your 1st dose of Pfizer between 7th December 2020 – 30th April 2021 and not yet received your invite for your second vaccine, please complete the following form on our website:
