

Covid-19 Vaccine for those aged 16 and above

Those aged 16 years and above, or it has been 8 weeks since your first dose, can now walk in to any of our vaccination clinics to receive your Covid-19 vaccination.


VACCINATION FIGURES

Covid-19 Third Vaccine

We are awaiting the final JCVI guidance on who will be in scope for the booster programme. We are unable to advise on the date of when a booster programme will start as we are expecting the final JCVI guidance to advise on who should be offered a booster vaccine. As soon as final JCVI guidance is received we will issue communication.

In the meantime, we ask residents that they **do not contact** the Health Board to request an appointment, but we do ask that resident's details held with their GP Practice are up-to-date (including telephone numbers). Residents in scope for offer of a booster vaccine will be invited by letter for appointment and should wait for their appointment.

Pregnant Women receiving the Covid-19 Vaccine

Pregnant women, women who are trying to get pregnant and women who are breastfeeding are being encouraged to get their COVID-19 vaccinations. This is in line with JCVI guidance, which states that all pregnant women, women who are trying to get pregnant and women who are breastfeeding should be offered the COVID-19 vaccination, to protect themselves and their babies from the risks of COVID-19.

Most pregnant women who get COVID-19 are not seriously ill. However, there is a small risk of serious illness for mother and baby, such as needing intensive care admission and premature birth. These risks are higher later in pregnancy and in women who have underlying health conditions.
