We would like to thank all Aneurin Bevan University Health Board residents who have taken up the Covid-19 vaccination offer.

Since the launch of the COVID-19 vaccine programme on 8th December 2020, the Vaccination Team have administered a total of 956,495 Covid-19 vaccinations.

Residents from 77 care homes for older adults within the Health Board area have been offered the booster vaccine. We have vaccinated 16,437 people aged 80 years and over, and over 24,051 frontline health and social care staff.

Please keep your Appointment

If you receive an appointment please do everything you can to attend the first appointment you are sent as we are vaccinating thousands of people every week. This will help the Mass Vaccination Programme to roll-out the booster programme to eligible individuals as quickly as possible.

12 to 15 years of age

Aneurin Bevan University Health Board can confirm that all 12 to 15 year olds have been offered a Covid-19 Vaccination appointment, to attend a clinic by the 26th October 2021.

If you have been unable to attend, please contact the booking team on 0300 303 1373 to make an appointment for your first dose, or attend the dedicated 12-15 year old walk-in session on Sunday, 31st October

Immunosuppressed and requiring a third primary dose?

If as a result of your condition or medication you were severely immunosuppressed at the time of your first or second dose you may require a **third primary dose** prior to any booster vaccination. If you feel this is you please complete the form below ensuring you provide all the information requested. Once we receive the information we will contact your clinician to confirm your position and get back in contact with you.

Still not received a first dose OR still outstanding your second dose of COVID-19 vaccination?

If you still haven't received your **first dose** or you are **outstanding your second dose** of COVID-19 vaccination then please complete the form on the link below ensuring you provide all the information requested. Once we receive the information we will check your previous vaccination record and if accurate contact you with detail of your appointment within 72 hours.

Please note for second dose you must be at least eight weeks from your first dose.

If you received your second dose of COVID-19 vaccination on or before March 31st 2021 and are yet to receive an offer of a booster appointment then please complete the form on the link below ensuring you provide all the information requested. Once we receive the information we will check your previous vaccination record and eligibility for the booster, if you are due a booster vaccination, our team will contact you.
