## Weekly Progress (21-29 November)

Aneurin Bevan University Health Board has administered a total of 161,673 booster doses and 9,277 third doses since 20th September 2021. The total figure for vaccinations given since the programme began stands at an incredible 1,072,032.

### Following the JCVI announcement on 29th November:

- Booster jabs will be offered to all over 18s
- Gap between second dose and booster reduced to from three months
- Children aged 12-15 years will also be invited for a second dose - 12 weeks after first dose

### Booster Appointments

Everyone who received their **second dose** of COVID-19 vaccination on or before **30th April 2021** should now have been invited for their booster vaccine. If for any reason you have not received an invite, please fill in the form on our website, we will check your previous vaccination record and eligibility for the booster dose. If you are due a booster vaccination, our team will contact you.

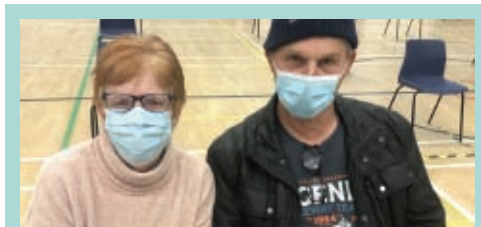

## BOOSTER VACCINATION FIGURES

(up to 10pm, 29/11/2021)

Age 80 and over	24,360	83.6%
75-79 years	20,371	85.8%
70-74 years	27,732	84.6%
65-69 years	26,234	80.4%
60-64 years	16,642	43.9%
Clinically extremely vulnerable	6,153	41.8%
At risk groups	23,623	34.4%

## Second Doses for 16-17 year olds



Following JCVI guidance, the Health Board is inviting those age 16-17 years old for their second dose of the Covid-19 vaccination. Those eligible will receive an invitation via text and/or letter by 18th December.

Ben, pictured left with Nurse Gaia, had his second dose of the Covid-19 vaccination at Newport Vaccination Centre. Ben said, "I'm having the second vaccine as it's important for your health and it helps to protect everyone."
