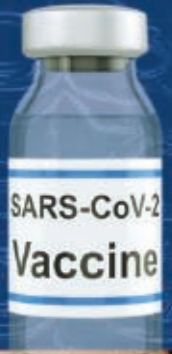

### Appointments

We are currently vaccinating according to JCVI guidelines and are calling people by age and vulnerability. We are working as quickly as possible.

**PLEASE BE PATIENT - WE WILL CONTACT YOU.**

Appointments will be offered via letter, or text and may be at short notice. It is important to attend the first appointment offered. Due to the high volumes of people we are currently vaccinating, if you have to cancel your appointment, or change the date, you may have to wait some weeks before it can be re-scheduled.
