#### Weekly Progress (3 - 10 January)



In response to the challenge set by Welsh Government, we have offered Booster vaccinations to anyone eligible through a range of methods including letters, texts, online booking and walk-in options. In our Health Board area, working in conjunction with GP Practices, we administered 100,285 vaccines (first, second, booster) in the 14 days that we were open between 16th December and 31st December (closing 2 days over Christmas).

This month we will be contacting everyone who couldn't make their appointment by letter and/or text to re-invite them for their Booster vaccination, and to offer second dose appointments for 12-15 year olds who received their first dose at least 12 weeks ago (in October). Please make every effort to attend your allocated time.

# A statement from the Health Minister

Health Minister Eluned Morgan issued a statement about the vaccination Booster programme, she said, "The response from the public has been outstanding and we want to thank everyone who kept their appointment and accepted the offer of their booster.

A huge thank you also goes to our NHS Wales teams, their partner organisations and all volunteers who have worked tirelessly through such a busy time to deliver this monumental task.

Over the Christmas period we were pleased to see an increase in people coming forward to receive their first and second doses of the vaccine. Thank you to everyone who is still coming forward to get vaccinated."

### NEW JCVI vaccination advice for children and young people

Children aged 5 to 11, who are in a clinical risk group or who are a household contact of someone (of any age) who is immunosuppressed, will be offered a primary course of vaccination. Work is underway to identify residents within this group and they will receive a formal invitation letter to attend clinic by the end of January/beginning of February.

#### **Boosters**

The JCVI has advised that booster vaccinations should be offered to persons aged 16 to 17 years; 12 to 15 who are in a clinical risk group or who are a household contact of someone (of any age) who is immunosuppressed; and 12 to 15 years who are severely immunocompromised and who have had a third primary dose. Appointment letters will be sent in the post when groups become eligible.

### Road closure near General Offices, Ebbw Vale

From 4 January until 1 July 2022, a section of road will be closed near our vaccination centre at General Offices in Ebbw Vale.

The town's 200 year old Big Arch is undergoing restoration, therefore a section of Steel Works Road (B4485) that passes under the bridge will be closed, both ways, from Lime Avenue to Ebbw Vale Football Club. Diversion signs are in place.
