Having the Covid-19 vaccination and boosters is your best weapon against this virus. Whilst we are seeing a large number through the vaccination centres, there are still some residents that are eligible, who remain unvaccinated or who have not yet attended their booster appointment. Around 100 residents per day are visiting our centres for their first vaccination, it really is never too late!

If you are eligible and yet to have your first or second dose of the Covid-19 vaccination, or your booster, you can get protected today by:

Aged 5-11 household contact with someone who is immunosuppressed:

Do you look after a child aged 5 – 11 within your household, living alongside someone who is immunosuppressed? If so, this age category are now eligible for a Covid-19 vaccination.

Once this form has been received we will review the details provided to confirm the individual meets the above criteria of a household contact of an immunosuppressed resident and contact you accordingly.
