New homes in Mountbatten

Families have now moved in to the 24 new homes we've built in Mountbatten Close, to replace a four-story 1960s block of flats.

The new homes are highly energy efficient, meaning cheaper energy bills for the new occupants. With solar panels, heat pump technology and increased insulation, these homes are designed to make life easier for customers – and will help meet the housing need for future generations.

Matt Davies, executive director of development, from Newport City Homes, said: "Our development and regeneration masterplan has started to transform the area. Thanks to funding support from the Welsh Government's social housing grant programme, and support of Newport City Council, we've continued in our aim to provide the high-quality homes that we also brought to the Cot Farm area of the estate in 2020 for the first phase.

"As each part of the project gets completed, customers can see the improvements being made around the area and this demonstrates our commitment to the communities we work with. We are proud to be bringing a range of affordable homes on sites throughout the city to help the housing crisis."

The new homes are made up of:

- Six one-bed apartments
- Six two-bed apartments
- Eight two-bed houses
- Four three-bed houses

All the homes are for social rent through Home Options Newport. Cwmbran-based company Pendragon Design and Build built the homes on behalf of Newport City Homes.

LOVELL UPDATE

2023 Works

During 2023, we arranged for the utility providers to complete diversion works around Ringland. The site is now ready for construction activities to commence in the New Year.

The only remaining work is to disconnect streetlights in the existing car park area, scheduled for January 2024. Simultaneously, the post box will be relocated outside the site boundary.

Spring 2024 Transformation

During the spring, we will also complete drainage work around Ringland, as well as reducing ground levels to the site, and moving material to stockpiles for future use.

Demolition Commencement

We are planning to start the demolition work in March 2024 and complete it in Spring 2024.

After the demolition of the old Friendship Pub and McColl's premises, we will fill the areas to match the new levels. Additionally, we will form a haul road into the rear of the site.





Foundation Commencement

Foundation works for the new retail/residential blocks will commence in the summer 2024, ahead of the steel frame structures being installed in autumn 2024.

In the early phases of the project, we will also establish welfare/office/parking/storage areas in the existing grass areas off Cot Farm Circle and Hendre Farm Drive.

Christmas service changes

Bin collections will not take place on Christmas Day or New Year's Day. All collections in those weeks will be a day late, running Tuesday to Saturday.

All council services based at Newport Central Library (Customer Services, Planning, Housing and Council Tax) will be closed on 26 December and 1 January.

The council contact centre will be open during normal business hours over the Christmas period. It will not be open on Christmas Day, Boxing Day or New Year's Day.

Our cemetery office will be open during normal business hours. The gates to the cemetery sites will remain open throughout the holiday period from Christmas Eve through to 2 January.

Voter ID

In Wales you are now legally required to show photo identification (ID) when voting at a polling station for the Police and Crime Commissioner and UK parliamentary elections, including general elections.

You will not need to show photo ID to vote at Senedd elections or local council elections. Acceptable forms of ID include passport, driving licence (including provisional), blue badge and some concessionary travel cards.

You will only need to show one form of photo ID, but it needs to be the original version and not a photocopy. The name on your ID must be the same name you used to register to vote. It can be expired as long as the photograph still looks like you do now.

If you don't have an acceptable form of photo ID, you can apply for a free voter ID document – a voter authority certificate.

Supporting community warm spaces

A grant scheme for community organisations to offer warm spaces to residents is being expanded this year following it success last year.

Once again partnering with GAVO, Newport City Council hopes to be able to assist at least 25 groups with the potential for 700 sessions open to 9000 people.

The third sector organisations will offer a safe, welcoming and comfortable environment to people who may be struggling to heat their homes or at risk of isolation.

Treberth and Bishpool Over 50's Network, led by the Integrated Wellbeing Network, part of Aneurin Bevan Local Health Board, and supported by a network of organisations, partners, and community leaders, hold two events annually to raise awareness of available services and to deliver targeted health and wellbeing information and campaigns.

This month saw Y Sied hosting the latest event, with the resident's community group throwing open their doors to welcome visitors from the wider community.

Jessica Morden, MP for Newport East, Helena Herklotts, Older Person's Commissioner for Wales, and Councillors Emma Stowell-Corten and Jason Hughes were among the guests who met residents and enjoyed a tour of the new development, taking the opportunity to cut the ribbon and officially open the new salon and community shop which are at the heart of the scheme.

The first part of the event saw a market style event, with service and community stalls, focused on community, wellbeing, and financial resilience, helping to prepare people with knowledge for winter planning.
