

PAEDIATRIC NUTRITION AND DIETETIC SERVICE REFERRAL CRITERIA

Registered Dietitians (RDs) are the only qualified health professionals that assess, diagnose and treat diet and nutrition problems at an individual and wider public health level. Dietitians use the most up to date research, guidelines and National Service Frameworks to inform their practice.

Dietitians are the only nutrition professionals to be statutorily regulated, and governed by an ethical code, to ensure that they always work to the highest standard.

All referrals must clearly indicate or include the following:

- The reason for dietetic referral
- Completion of **every section** of the referral form. Incomplete referrals will be returned to the referrer to complete in full.
- Current weight and height
- Details of previous growth
- Relevant past medical and dietary history
- Relevant medication
- Relevant social history e.g. home situation, mental health, child protection
- Supporting Information if available: Copy of growth chart if this is applicable.

It is the responsibility of the referrer to request parental consent prior to making the referral and to explain the reason for the referral.

Referrals are received from a variety of health professionals including GP's, Consultant Paediatricians, Specialist Nurses, Practice Nurses, Health Visitor and School nurses. Primary Care can e-refer via the Welsh Clinical Communications Gateway (WCCG) and secondary care consultants can refer via internal referrals or using the referral form as follows: <u>http://howis.wales.nhs.uk/sitesplus/866/page/40340</u>

Consent to referral for ALL children must be AGREED by parents/carers.

Process:

- Referrals will be prioritised by the Dietitian with reference to departmental guidelines
- Accepted referrals will be assessed by the Dietitian and the outcome of the assessment & care plan fed back to the referral source, service user/carers and MDT
- Dietetic assessment will usually take place in a clinic environment
- Follow-up will be carried out by the Dietitian and /or other healthcare professional as deemed appropriate.

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
