AIRWAY

- CHOKING
- COMPLETE AIRWAY OBSTRUCTION

BREATHING

- INEFFECTIVE BREATHING (so short of breath, unable to talk between breaths / dangerously low SpO2 despite oxygen / etc).
- RESPIRATORY ARREST

CIRCULATION

- CARDIAC ARREST
- MASSIVE UNCONTROLLABLE BLEEDING

DISABILITY

- UNCONSCIOUS (trauma/medical event)
PLEASE CHECK BLOOD SUGAR
- CURRENTLY FITTING (not post-ictal patients)
PLEASE CHECK BLOOD SUGAR

OTHER

- ACTIVE LABOUR
- OTHER OBSTETRIC EMERGENCIES (eg. Massive haemorrhage post-delivery, resuscitation measures needed needed for mother or baby)

Phone the ABUHB Flow Centre on **0300 3033557** and select '**Intersite Transfer**'. A Flight Marshall will assess the resource needed based on the clinical details provided and arrange this with relevant provider (either WAST or NEPTS)



In both circumstances please contact the relevant teams for support on-site as per the Standard Operating Procedure for the Unwell Self-Presenter

Pregnant women are classed as high risk (booked or requiring obstetric care) and will require a 999 transfer via ambulance. If the birth is imminent then the patient is to remain and call for support from midwife on the birth centre, as no obstetric doctors will be available on E-LGH sites.
