999 Criteria for Minor Injury Units

Does your patient meet any of these criteria?



AIRWAY

- CHOKING
- COMPLETE AIRWAY OBSTRUCTION

- INEFFECTIVE BREATHING (so short of breath, unable to talk between breaths / dangerously low Sp02 despite oxygen / etc).
- RESPIRATORY ARREST

BREATHING ICIRCULATION DISABILITY

- CARDIAC ARREST
- MASSIVE UNCONTROLLABLE BLEEDING

- OUNCONSCIOUS (trauma/medical event) BLOOD SUGAR
 - CURRENTLY FITTING (not post-ictal patients) PLEASE CHECK BLOOD SUGAR

- ACTIVE LABOUR
- OTHER OBSTETRIC EMERGENCIES

(eg. Massive haemorrhage post-delivery, resuscitation measures needed needed for mother or baby)

In both circumstances please contact the relevant teams for support on-site as per the Standard Operating Procedure for the Unwell Self-Presenter

Pregnant women are classed as high risk (booked or requiring obstetric care) and will require a 999 transfer via ambulance. If the birth is imminent then the patient is to remain and call for support from midwife on the birth centre, as no obstetric doctors will be available on E-LGH sites.
