The All Wales policy - A Clinical Policy for Do Not Attempt Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (DNACPR) for Adults in Wales applies to all staff and the care of patients of age 18 years and over in all care settings within the remit of NHS in Wales. This supports an individualised approach to decision making involving the patients where they have mental capacity or where a Lasting Power of Attorney is in place, an appointed attorney.
