We are not able to identify if the patient having been discharged/transferred from ICU/ITU survived. A number of patients may have been transferred from ICU/ITU and then sadly passed away in another, different ward or even at home (or in the community).

However, a COVID-specific Intensive Care National Audit and Research Centre (ICNARC) report has been produced by the National Intensive Care database team for the 1<sup>st</sup> wave, 2<sup>nd</sup> wave and the 3<sup>rd</sup> wave (current wave), which provides further information on patients admitted to ITU. Please Note:

- As above, we are not able to identify if the patient received ventilation whilst on ICU/ITU
- The above figures are based on the FIRST admission to ICU/ITU. Patients could have been transferred to ICU/ITU a number of times during their hospital stay and could also have been transferred from ICU/ITU in one hospital to ICU/ITU in a different hospital (particularly when GUH opened and critical care patients were transferred from either the RGH or NHH to GUH)
- The figures for RGH and NHH would only include the period before the GUH was opened
- The figures include patients who were on ICU/ITU at any point during their hospital stay i.e. they could have been admitted to ICU/ITU as their first ward or they could have been transferred to ICU/ITU having been on a different ward first. As above, patients could be transferred to and from ICU/ITU multiple times during their hospital stay.
- There is no ICU/ITU at either YAB or YYF
