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I would just like to clarify part of your response (FOI 20-373). Your response confirms that 33 critical beds were purchased from ARJO and further beds were transferred from other hospitals. However, we note from the website of The Grange University Hospital (you can click the link here) that "The hospital has 560 beds (including trollies and cots)".

In addition to ARJO, were any beds that are being used in Grange University Hospital procured from other suppliers? It may help if we provide you a PO number (M9128587D)

The capacity referred to on the website article you refer to is indeed correct within the Grange University Hospital (GUH) whereas capacity on our other sites has reduced.

The only critical care beds purchased were as previously stated 33 beds from ARJO during the initial COVID-19 pandemic. These were purchased by our All Wales Team and transferred to the GUH to support the early opening.

278 acute bed frames were purchased in March 2020 from Stryker utilising the NHS Supply Chain Framework. A further 72 beds were purchased of these acute beds from Stryker to support the COVID pandemic which again are all within the GUH.

I can confirm that the only other new beds purchased for the GUH are as follows:

22 Bariatric beds – ARJO – Via NHS Supply Chain Framework 15 Obstetric beds – HillRom

I can confirm that the purchase order number provided is not an Aneurin Bevan University Health Board purchase order number so cannot advise further on this (M9128587D).
