You requested the following:

- 1. How many women were treated for heart attacks in your hospital/GP over the last five years (January 2018 present)? (by age bracket if time allows)
- 2. Of the women experiencing heart attacks, how many experienced non-traditional symptoms such as the following? (by age bracket if time allows)
 - Dizziness or fainting
 - Nausea or vomiting
 - Pain, numbness, pinching or other uncomfortable sensation in your arm, jaw, back or stomach
 - Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing deeply
 - Unexplained sweating or cool, clammy skin
 - Unusual fatigue

2. We are unable to provide information on the symptoms experienced as we do not hold this information centrally. To comply with your request, we would need to review each individual patient record and we have established that it would take in excess of 18 hours to access this information and therefore exceeds the appropriate costs limit under Section 12 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000, which is currently £450. This is not an exemption which requires us to consider the application of the public interest test.
