

In relation to the Primary Care Mental Health Services (PCMHSS), the Health Board has consistently met the target of 80% plus of patient referrals receiving an assessment have been seen within 28 days over the past 3 years.

In regards to waiting list management for those awaiting first therapy contact. We have a cohort of patients that through circumstances have requested to wait for their intervention work. Where this has happened, and where there have peaks and troughs in demand on our service, any patient waiting has been sent a 3 monthly letter assuring them that they remain with the service and that they will be contacted when capacity allows. Some patients, particularly during the pandemic period have elected to wait longer. This has been for a variety of reasons, that include for example, wanting face to face therapy but not wanting to engage at a particular time.
