

I would be grateful if you could answer the below questions regarding your Adult ADHD services;

- 1. What is the current waiting list for Adult ADHD diagnosis?

 The diagnostic service for adults who suspect they may have ADHD commenced in the Health Board on 30th June 2022 and currently there is no waiting list as the <u>service</u> is new. However, referrals are starting to be received and it is anticipated that a waiting list will be required in the future to manage the demand.

- 3. What guidelines are primary care general practitioners expected to follow when accepting private shared care agreements for patients with diagnosed attention-deficit hyperactivity disorder?

 General Practitioner (GPs) are not directly obliged to follow shared care protocols provided by private practitioners, particularly if a proposed protocol is not aligned to a relevant protocol in secondary care or is beyond the knowledge and competency expected of a GP. However, GP's are expected to ensure that a patient is offered appropriate NHS specialist services for the provision of treatment, where the provision of the service is beyond the skills and competency normally expected of a GP.
- 4. Under either primary or secondary care, how many prescriptions for Adderall have been issued within the last 24 months?
 The Health Board has not had any usage of Adderall within the last 24-months.
