I have been asked to research how practice nurses are trained in the Aneurin Bevan area. This could be as continuing professional development for those nurses already with practice nursing experience, or for those new to the role.

Within the Health Board Practice Nurse training is provided via an Academy based approach called Aneurin Bevan Care Academy (ABCa).

ABCa was established to support Primary Care with the recruitment of Academy nurses to help fill General Practice Nurse vacancies and therefore support the sustainability of General Practices.

Nurses undertake an accelerated 6-month education programme covering all aspects of General Practice Nursing. The Education programme is also available to Practice Nurses already established in their roles and can form part of continuing professional development and revalidation processes.

The programme is delivered via a combination of virtual and face to face sessions and workshops. The training programme has been designed to cover key essential knowledge and skills required to be a practice nurse. This includes the following areas:
