This is an information request relating to artwork owned by your trust. Please provide the following information:

The Health Board holds a number of arts related assets across the Health Board however, this information is not held in one central register. The information provided below therefore provides information largely based on the list held via Charitable Funds.

1. How many artworks have been purchased by the trust in 2018-19, 2019-20, and 2020-21?

2019	Digital prints of fruit and flowers (Apple, Cherry, Bluebell, Daffodil) CasGwent Ward at Chepstow Community Hospital	£192.50

In 2020/21 the majority of direct or indirect spend by the Health Board on permanent art work would have been on the Arts programme at the Grange University Hospital, which was managed by Studio Response (an external public arts company). The final inventory of art commissioned by the Programme is currently being collated and as such is not available to the Health Board to share at this time.

2. How many artworks are in the possession of the trust?

Anwyllfan Ward, Ysbyty Ystrad Fawr Five corridor panel and lounge banners depicting photographs of Caerphilly Castle and other local landmarks	£553
Ysbyty Ystrad Fawr - Grounds A dragon sculpture purchased from charitable funds at a cost	Approx. £12,000
A painting called the Domestic Chaplain was donated to Caerphilly Miners Hospital (closed 2011). The painting is currently on loan to the National Museum of Wales, Cardiff where it was on display up until a few years ago and is now in storage at the museum.	Valued at £25,000

Description/Location	Cost
The Charitable Funds charity paid £100k to Gwent Arts in Health (GARTH) 2011/12 to 2013/14 for an arts programme, prior to this the charity paid for artists in residence. A number of artworks have been produced from these and are displayed across the Health Board.	£100,000
A textile project is underway as a commemorative COVID piece of artwork involving patients, staff and the community	£6,000
