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## I would be very keen to see some statistics on the amount of DNA/CPR's and therefore am submitting this FOI request for the following information:

- 1. How many DNA/CPR's have been issued to those with and without learning disabilities over the last 36 months.
- 2. What were the type of reasons provided in each case.
- 3. The amount of people in each group that have died after having a DNA/CPR issued, including the causes of death.

From 1<sup>st</sup> October 2015 the All-Wales DNACPR form has been the only agreed form for recording DNACPR decisions across Wales . For inpatients, a paper document is stored in a prominent place in the patient records and for individuals in the community, the record is held by the patient's GP. DNACPR status is not recorded electronically, and the requested information cannot be generated without reviewing the individual patient records of every individual for the last 36 months. Therefore, in order to comply with your request, the Health Board has established that this would exceed the appropriate costs limit under Section 12 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 which is currently £450. As you will be aware this is not an exemption which requires us to consider the application of the public interest test. We have calculated that it would take in excess of 18 hours to review the record of each patient.
