Please can you provide the following information.

For the last 10 years, or as many years as you have for that period, which you have data please provide a breakdown of:

 The number of Adult ADHD Assessments undertaken per year for up to the last 10 years. Ideally per calendar year.

Unfortunately Adult ADHD diagnostic assessments are not currently available routinely in Aneurin Bevan University Health Board and there is no reliable data on the number of referrals received. One reason for this is the age of the current patient information system used within mental health and learning disabilities. This system is due to be replaced next month.

We have recently set up a pilot ADHD diagnostic assessment clinic and data is able to be captured for referrals into this clinic separately. Figures are provided for patients seen between June 2021 and the end of September 2021. We would caveat that these figures will be a gross underestimate of the demand for ADHD diagnostic assessments and are simply the number of individuals seen in the recently established pilot clinic.
