Please can you confirm the daily numbers number for Oct 2020 in Nevill Hall Hospital.

Patients

- Number of Covid infections 157

- Number of Hospital Acquired Covid Infections 45

- Number of patients sent home without a test that were readmitted within a week and tested positive – This data is not collected
- Number of patients sent home without a test that were readmitted within a week and tested positive and died of covid – This data is not collected

Staff (dr, nurses, Bank staff, porters, cleaners,)

- **Number of tests** Due to the various routes of testing (health board, DHSC, home kits) it is not possible to provide a definitive answer, however I can confirm that the Occupational Health department recorded 224 tests in October for staff who were identified as working in Nevill Hall.
 - Overall, 2,004 tests were requested from Nevill Hall Hospital during that period, however it is not possible to identify how many of these related to staff.
- **Number of retests -** Of the 224 tests recorded by Occupational Health, 19 staff had 2 tests and 2 staff had 3 tests undertaken that month.

• **Number of positive tests** – Of the 224 tests recorded by Occupational Health, 34 were positive.

Of the 2,004 tests requested from NHH a total of 160 of these came back positive. This represents the number of positive tests and rather than positive patients.

Number of staff who worked across different wards

It is not possible to provide details of staff who worked across different wards. All of our staff are expected to work flexibly across the Health Board in order to meet the demands of our service. This practice was in place both prior to and during the pandemic.
