What is a blood test? A blood test is when a nurse or doctor takes a sample of blood to be tested.


Can I drink before my appointment?

It is a good idea to have a drink before you come into the hospital.



What can I bring with me?

Bring something that you like. This could be an iPad or a game.



The nurse or doctor will put some **magic cream** on your skin which makes the needle not hurt so much.

Step by step



They may put a **band around your arm** (tourniquet). This can make your veins easier to see.




They will put a needle into a vein and take a **small blood sample**. You may feel a sharp scratch.



When your blood test is finished, you can **go home or back to the ward**.

Coping with your worries

Don't worry if you feel scared or worried before your blood test - it is quite normal.
