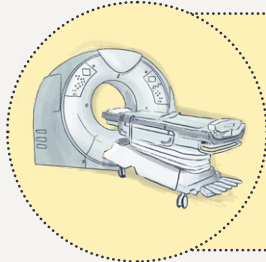


What is a CT Scan?

A CT scan is a quick scan which takes pictures of inside your body.



Who is a radiographer?

A radiographer is a person who will be doing your CT Scan.



Will it hurt?

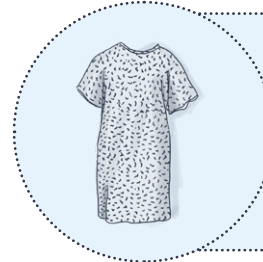
The CT Scan will not hurt.



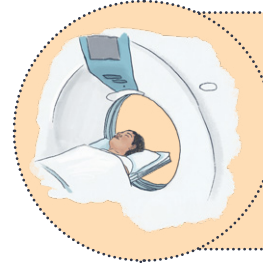
What happens after?

A radiologist will look at the images and send a report to your doctor.

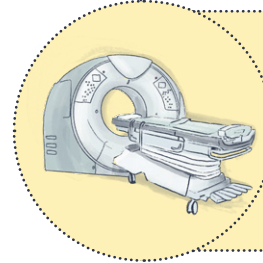
Step by step



You may need to wear special **hospital clothes**.



You will be asked to **lie still on the scanning table**.



The table will **move your body through the scanner** so that it can take some pictures.






When the CT Scan is finished, you can **go home or back to the ward**.

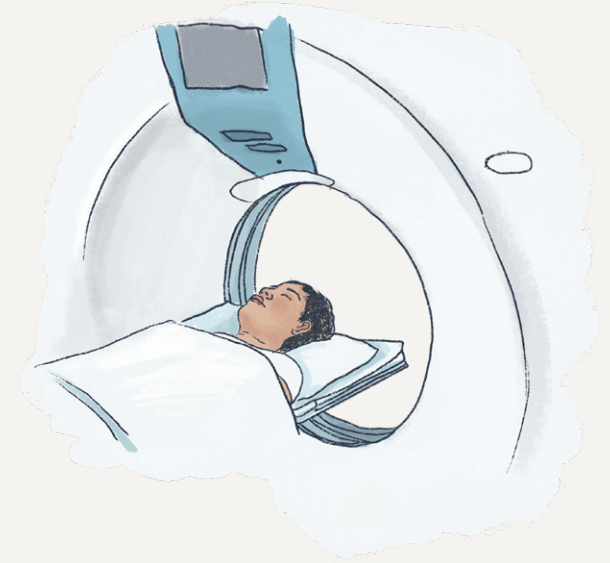
Coping with your worries

Don't worry if you feel scared or worried before your CT Scan – **it is quite normal.**



If you need help with your worries look around and try to find...

-  **4 things** you can see
-  **3 things** you can touch
-  **2 things** you can hear
-  **1 thing** you can smell
