What is an ultrasound?

An ultrasound takes special pictures of inside your body.



Who is a sonographer?

A sonographer is a person who will be doing your ultrasound.



Will it hurt?

The ultrasound scan should not hurt and it can be stopped at any time.



What happens after?

A report of your scan will be sent to your doctor to look at.

Step by step



You will be asked to **lie down** on the hospital bed.



The sonographer will put some gel on your skin. They will move the probe over the area of your body being scanned.



A picture of inside your body will be shown on a **computer screen**.



When the ultrasound is finished, you can get up and get dressed and go home or back to the ward.

Coping with your worries

Don't worry if you feel scared or worried before your ultrasound – it is quite normal.

3 things you can touch



2 things you can hear

1 thing you can smell
