What is Fundal Photography?

Fundal Photography is taking photographs through a dilated pupil, of the retina and back of your eye to provide a permanent record of your eye condition.

What do I need to do before the test?

Please report to reception desk on arrival.

Please take your normal diet and normal medication.

Approximately one hour before your appointment time please apply the eye-drops supplied to:-

You will have eye drops that make your vision blurred. Please ensure that someone accompanies you to the clinic. We also advise that you do not drive.

What happens during the test?

When you arrive for the photographs you may find your vision is blurred, this will settle when the drops wear off in a few hours. You will be then taken into the camera room where several photographs of your eye will be taken.

How soon can I go home after the test?

You can go straight home after the test but your vision will be blurred for a few hours after the procedure.
