### What is Fundal Photography?

Fundal Photography is taking photographs through a dilated pupil, of the retina and back of your eye to provide a permanent record of your eye condition.

### What do I need to do before the test?

Please take your normal diet and normal medication.

Approximately one hour before your appointment time please apply the eye-drops supplied to:-

You will have eye drops that make your vision blurred. **Please ensure that someone accompanies you to the clinic. We also advise that you do not drive.**

### What happens during the test?

When you arrive for the photographs you may find your vision is blurred, this will settle when the drops wear off in a few hours. You will be then taken into the camera room where several photographs of your eye will be taken.

### How soon can I go home after the test?

You can go straight home after the test but your vision will be blurred for a few hours after the procedure.
