Care of the Mouth after a biopsy under local Anaesthesia

- 1. **Do not rinse your mouth for the rest of the day** it may start the socket bleeding.
- 2. **Do not bite the numb areas of your mouth** and do not smoke until the numbness has gone.
- 3. For the rest of the day take things quietly. Take only cool non-alcoholic drinks. Eat a soft diet.
- 4. **To stop bleeding**, apply pressure with gauze swabs or folded handkerchief for 10-15 minutes.
- Oral hygiene is important. Provided bleeding has stopped, start mouthwashes the next day. Dissolve a teaspoonful of common salt in a tumbler full of warm water and use as a mouthwash. Do this after all meals. Do not rinse vigorously. Use your toothbrush in areas of the mouth away from the surgical site.
- 6. Discomfort and slight swelling may be expected for a few days. **Pain killers may be taken if required.**
- 7. The stitches in your mouth are dissolvable, but they can take up to 60 days to disappear.
- 8. Your follow up appointment will be in _____ days. Please make appointment at the desk on leaving.

Inform the department by telephone if you have:-

- Persistent bleeding
- An increase in swelling or pain
- Any other cause for anxiety
