## Care of the mouth after minor surgical operations (e.g. Apicectomy) under local Anaesthesia

- 1. **Do not rinse your mouth** for the rest of the day.
- 2. **Do not bite the numb areas of your mouth** and do not smoke until the numbness has gone.
- 3. Try not to lift the lip (to have a look) for the first few hours.
- 4. For the rest of the day take things quietly. Take only cool non-alcoholic drinks. Eat a soft diet.
- 5. **If bleeding starts,** apply pressure with gauze swabs, for at least five minutes.
- 6. Oral hygiene is important. Provided bleeding has stopped, you should start mouthwashes the next day. Dissolve a teaspoonful of common salt in a tumbler full of warm water and use as a mouthwash. Do this after all meals. Do not rinse vigorously. Use your toothbrush in areas of the mouth away from the wound.
- 7. Discomfort and slight swelling may be expected for a few days. **Pain killers may be taken if required.**
- 8. If you have had a sedative injection into your arm as part of your treatment, do not drive, go out unaccompanied, or carry out any activity involving risk (e.g. boiling a kettle) for at least 24 hours.

## Inform the department by telephone if you have:-

- Persistent bleeding
- An increase in swelling or pain
- Any other cause for anxiety
