Winter Planning Events



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NCN Communications & Engagement Update

Winter planning events have taken place across localities in Gwent. This was a new and innovative approach, providing an opportunity to make a difference during difficult times over the winter period. The events had representation from a range of clinical services from secondary, community and primary care and were supplemented with key 3rd sector stakeholders, who often assist with admission avoidance and/or early discharge.

The events acknowledged the fragility of service sustainability across clinical services, which is particularly fragile during the winter period. They also provided detailed insight to the services that are available across the localities within Gwent and associated pathways. Potential barriers were identified along with proposed solutions to ensuring the patient pathway is a clear, streamlined process. Alternatives to admission were also showcased.

Blaenau Gwent Flu Campaign 2023



As part of the Blaenau Gwent Flu Campaign for 2023, the Locality team are focusing on improving uptake amongst the 2–3-year-old cohort and are working in collaboration with the school nursing team. Datix has improved tremendously being at 21 open reviews at Wednesday 13th Sept for BG D/N, with an expectation to reduce to 0 imminently, the process should support sustaining the manageability of incidents (we are waiting for RCA - some patients have multiples)

Caerphilly's Community Garden

Caerphilly locality and IWN have linked with Keep Wales Tidy to provide a local garden area for the local community, patients of Trethomas Health Centre and Staff.

Keep Wales Tidy are a charity committed to working with local communities across Wales to protect our environment now and in the future. Thier vision is for a beautiful Wales cared for and enjoyed by everyone.

Links were made and a garden package was secured for installing at Trethomas Health Centre.

The purpose of the garden is to bring the community closer, improving health and wellbeing of patients, the local community and staff in giving people something they can be proud of and want to spend time tinkering about with.

The garden has gathered interest from quite a few people that have visited the site and from around the neighbouring streets, there are now 3 locals that will join the IWN and Caerphilly locality team in maintaining and looking after this area.

There will not be much to do this time of the year as the plants will go back to their root but come spring, we should see the plants grow and make a lovely entrance to our building and this will be the time we will actively look for further volunteers. It is a work in progress, we chose the wildlife garden as it is a small project and felt that starting little and working up to something bigger in the future.

Monmouthshire

Monmouthshire's Got it in the Bag!

A initiative to make the admission into hospital more efficient was launched in Monmouthshire. The red bag scheme is in place to help improve patient experiences for care home residents who have to go into hospital.

The Monmouthshire Red Bag Scheme focuses on when a resident becomes unwell and is assessed as needing hospital care, care home staff pack a dedicated red bag, that includes all the standardised paperwork and medication, as well as personal items such as glasses, dentures and hearing aids.

The red bag ensures that ambulance and hospital staff can quickly understand a resident's condition and personal needs – as well as facilitate a smooth transfer when they are ready to be discharged from hospital.



When a resident is discharged, the ward nurses ensures that all the paperwork is included, such as a discharge summary, medication changes etc, delivering person centered care across Monmouthshire.

Severn View Park New Build update

As you know the deadline for moving in was set for September this year.

Work is ongoing with colleagues and the Contractors to establish a clear and defined programme now that the project is so well progressed.

For a number of reasons it is disappointing to share that we will not be able to move in this year and the plan is now to move on the 4th March 2024.

The programme timeline has always been 16 months to build the home and 2 months to manage the move from the current home to the new. Because of the pandemic, timescales shifted significantly but we expected build completion to be July this year and a move in date of sometime in September.

As you would expect, projects of this size are complex and the programme dates are given as approximate. During the last 18 months we have had many challenges that have affected the project. Terrible weather in January / February this year introduced a five week delay. However, the most significant issues for the last 6 months have been to do with the services to the site; specifically the water supply but a solution was finally found and work commenced in May.

Newport Health Fayre

The Health Fayre proved to be a fantastic day with the Muslim
Doctors Cymru Team being fantastic and very busy all day.
Approximately 80 people visited the event, with lots of appetite from the community.



The day included: CVD screening; DBST hepatitis; 35 tests done and even had to turn people away; C19 vaccinations; Advice on Childhood immunisations; Melo and Afshan Morgan Wellbeing advisor; Alzheimer's team attendance; Lifestyle advice given; Population screening advice and lifestyle and the Level 1 (website), Level 2 Slimming World (weight management support); lots of people didn't know that it is free on the NHS!

Clock Cricket is back

On Wednesday 11th October 2023, Clock Cricket made it's comeback at St Woolos Hospital following a period of absence due to covid.

Several patients took part from different wards and was enjoyed by all. One family member who happened to be visiting at the time of the event (and even took part!) stated "I'm really surprised to see mum up and about; this is the first time since she's been here. Newport Psychological Health Practitioners (PHP)

Within Newport NCN the Psychological Health Practitioners (PHP) are staggered across both the East and West.

The services offer low level psychological and wellbeing intervention and support thus reducing the demand upon GP appointments for issues of this nature.

In Newport we have expanded the service further to meet local population needs within the city by offering a dedicated PHP that is solely aimed at ethnic communities. Afshan Morgan who is the dedicated PHP offers support across both NCN's and utilises her contacts and experience to engage with local communities that would traditionally not present at a GP practice with these issues. The service is proving to be a huge success, Afshan speaks several languages which also helps to connect with some local communities and advice of the services available to them. The Outreach PHP service receives referrals from GPs but the majority of clients/patients are identified by Ashfan through community working. Torfaen

Age Connects Torfaen

Age Connects Torfaen is the operating title of Age Concern Torfaen, an independent charity for older people living in Torfaen and surrounding areas. They have over 30 years experience dedicated to supporting older people, carers and their families. Age Connects Torfaen is a locally based charity, which aims to provide services for Younger and Older People, along with their Carers over the age of 50, with Dementia and those experiencing loneliness. Their mission is to continually strive to improve quality of life of Older People along with encouraging, empowering and promoting wellbeing whilst maintaining their independence. Torfaen Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm's Screening

The Wales Aortic Aneurysm Screening Programme (WAASP) was set up in 2013 to reduce the amount of deaths due to ruptured Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm's (AAA). The programme only invites men aged 65 and over for a simple ultrasound of their abdomen to determine if they have an AAA or not. This is because it is six times more common to find a AAA in a man than a woman. If an aneurysm has been detected, these men are then invited back onto a surveillance programme to monitor the growth of their aneurysm. If we find a large aneurysm, these men are then referred into secondary care to discuss treatment options, which normally involves surgery to repair the aneurysm. The screeners who perform the scans are highly skilled and trained to perform the ultrasound scan of the abdominal aorta only and they are able to give the results at the end of the scan.

Services began in County Hospital on 28th September, and Blaenavon Resource Centre on 9th October.

Local Gender Team

The Local Gender Team (LGT) was established in May 2020 and the clinic itself is called locally the "Alex Clinic". The Team work in close conjunction with the Welsh Gender Team (WGT), and accept any referrals for Aneurin Bevan University Health Board patients over the age of 18, requiring hormone therapy. They originally started with 15 patients and, as of July, there were 136 active patients with 80 on a waiting list. They are currently working from the Cedar Unit in County Hospital, Pontypool, and use facilities at the **Outpatients Department for** administering hormone injections to certain patients.

The team consists of 2 Clinicians, Dr Eleri Roberts and Dr Sarah Jones, and an Administrator, Charlotte Black.

The aim is to help and support patients safely through their transition pathway.

The collaboratives will capture the knowledge and experience of local professionals to map service provision, identify gaps and develop against needs.

Blaenau Gwent Nursing Collaborative

Blaenau Gwent held their Professional Nursing Collaborative launch on 20th September in Brynmawr.

The launch was attended by representatives from different nursing specialities across the Blaenau Gwent area. The aim was to use and optimise on their expertise to discuss new ways of working and to work collaboratively. The launch / meeting was chaired by Jo Lane, Deputy Head of Nursing Primary Care and Community Services, supported by Dr Isolde Shore-Nye NCN Lead for Blaenau Gwent East and the Blaenau Gwent Locality team. Discussions were undertaken to ascertain shared aims and objectives for the collaborative.


