New Developments on the Horizon

A number of exciting new developments for the Health Board are either underway or at an advanced planning stage. These new developments, set to cost around £150 million in total, are in addition to our plans to improve the environment of many of our sites over the next few years.

Here's a summary update of the major capital projects we are currently working on:

Unified Breast Unit at Ysbyty Ystrad Fawr – The construction of new purpose built Breast Unit will bring together diagnostic, treatment and surgical services that are currently spread across three hospitals. It is anticipated that work will start on the site of this new unit in November 2021, with completion expected in December 2022.

Cancer Services at Nevill Hall Hospital -

Approval has just been received from Welsh Government to relocate the existing Ante-Natal clinic to make way for new a Satellite Radiotherapy Unit. This project is being developed in collaboration with Velindre NHS Trust, who will run the planned new Radiotherapy service. Work on the relocation of the Ante-Natal clinic will start in October. The construction of the new Radiotherapy Unit is planned to commence in the Spring of 2022 and it should be operational in early 2024. A



new Cancer Unit is also planned to be provided at Nevill Hall, housing Haematology and Chemotherapy Out-Patient and day case services. This is planned to be on site by early 2023 and will take approximately one year to complete.

New Health and Wellbeing Centre at Tredegar Hospital – The old redundant hospital has been demolished to make way for a new Health and Well Being Centre. The new Centre is planned to accommodate two GP practices, Pharmacy and General Dental services plus a comprehensive range of Health Board community services. Construction of the new Centre commenced this month and it is due to be completed by December 2022, following which the existing Tredegar Health Centre will be demolished to make way for car parking and landscaping.

New Health and Well-Being Centre at Newport East (Ringland) – A similar Health and Well-Being centre is also planned for the Newport East area, replacing the existing health centre in Ringland. As with Tredegar, the new centre will accommodate two GP practices, General Dental services and a range of Health Board services. There will also be a mental health presence in the building, plus community dental services. The new building



is planned to be co-located with the existing Local Authority Community Hub. Approval to proceed with this development is expected in early 2022, with the overall development is expected to take nearly three years to complete.

Specialist Mental Health Service development at Llanfrechfa Grange – A new

£60 million development is being considered to be built on the Llanfrechfa Grange site to accommodate a range of specialist mental health in-patient services, including Low Secure, Locked Rehabilitation, Intensive Care, Learning Disability and Crisis Assessment accommodation. The development is currently at Outline Business Case stage, with construction planned to commence in the autumn of 2023.

We will keep staff updated on the progress of all of these developments.

Smoke-Free Environment Policy

September saw the start of a new team of six Smoke-Free Environment Officers based at the Royal Gwent, Nevill Hall and The Grange University Hospital as well as our community hospitals. The team are working to keep all hospital grounds smoke-free, promote healthy and clean care environments and help support



smokers to quit, whether they are patients, visitors or hospital staff.

This is part of co-ordinated activity to ensure compliance with our Smoke-Free Environment Policy and the new Welsh Government regulations, making it illegal to smoke on hospital grounds throughout Wales.

From 1st October 2021, a new two stage warning system will be in place for Health Board Staff who breach the Smoke-Free Environment Policy. This will include:

- Any member of staff smoking on site should expect to be approached by our Smoke-Free Officers.
- The Smoke-Free Officer will issue them with a first official warning.
- If seen smoking a second time, staff will be issued with a second official warning.
- A second warning will result in the member of staff being reported to line managers/supervisors via a Datix System and ABUHB disciplinary procedures will be followed.

The aim of these new actions is to discourage people from breaching the Smoke-Free Environment Policy. We hope this will result in further reducing the amount of smoking on hospital grounds.

COVID Update

Community COVID-19 case incidence rates continue to rise across the Health Board, with 4,053 cases in the last 7 days in the ABUHB area which is an incidence of 655.6/100,000, up 173.4/100,000 on the previous 7 days.



There are currently 100 admitted patients reported as COVID-19 positive or suspected and 91 patients as recovering from COVID-19 within ABUHB hospitals with currently 5 COVID-19 patients in ITU.

Our hospitals remain extremely busy, thank you to staff across the Health Board area for the care and compassion they are showing to our patients and service users during the continued challenges.

National Audit of Care at the End of Life

Have you experienced the care provided for our patients at the end of their lives and feel you can contribute to improving the quality of care that we provide?

The National Audit of Care at the End of Life (NACEL) is a national comparative audit of the quality and outcomes of care experienced by the dying person and those important to them during the last admission leading to death in inpatient facilities across England, Wales and Northern Ireland.
