Message from our Medical Director

Dr James Calvert, the Health Board's Medical Director, has recorded a video message for staff which can be viewed on the Intranet:

With the exceptional pressures that our healthcare services are currently facing, Calvert recognises that staff are tired due to our COVID-19 pandemic response. Dr Calvert recorded this video to give a true picture of the current position, as well



as to encourage and reassure staff that improvements are being made to improve the current situation.

Despite recent negative media coverage and social media comments relating to The Grange University Hospital, Dr Calvert explained that pressures across the entire system are presenting challenges to our new hospital system. Even so, Dr Calvert is confident that improvements are being made, with ambulance delays at GUH reducing, and that by working together across the whole Health Board, we can make our healthcare system the 'best one in Wales'. Thank you to all staff for their ongoing efforts to deliver the highest possible standards of patient care.

New Intranet Coming

The Health Board's Communications and Engagement Team is working with Informatics colleagues to replace the current staff Intranet with a new platform.

The new and improved Intranet will be fully integrated with Office 365 features, and fit for purpose for the digital future. The current Cascade Intranet, which has become outdated, will be switched off in March 2022.



The new Intranet, which will be delivered through SharePoint, will be accessible to staff in work and also from home and on personal mobile devices. This means staff will have better and easier access to workplace news and information.

COVID Safety Measures Remain Unchanged

Although Saturday 7th August saw further easing of legal restrictions across Wales under Alert Level 0, the Health Board's COVID safety measures remain unchanged. Staff are reminded to continue to follow the principal safety controls outlined below to ensure that you, your colleagues, our patients and services are protected:

- Maintain a physical distance of 2 metres from others
- Wear a face mask (and correctly) when inside Health Board premises (this is still a legal requirement in Wales)
- Adhere to PPE requirements in accordance with clinical pathways and IP&C advice
- Regularly wash your hands and apply alcohol gel
- Improve ventilation in your work environment by opening windows and utilising mechanical ventilation
- Regularly clean and disinfect your work environment, especially touch points and shared equipment
- Continue to test and isolate if you develop COVID symptoms
- Continue to support the twice weekly LFD staff testing
- Temperature recording and completion of the pre shift screening questions
- Staggered breaks/use of changing rooms to allow for social distancing as you are unable to wear face covering
- Car sharing if essential, staff to wear masks
- Support the HB visiting policy

Coronavirus is still with us and still poses a significant risk to public health. We all have a responsibility to help minimise this risk, and we would like to thank you for your ongoing support with these key measures. Please be assured the Infection Prevention Team, in collaboration with Health & Safety, are consistently reviewing the guidelines.

Vaccination Update

Up to 16th August, 435,244 first doses and 409,881 second doses of the Covid-19 vaccine have been given across the Health Board area.



Mental Health Detention Update

Did you know there was a new process for any patient being detained under the Mental Health Act (ie. patients on a section)?

As of the 28th July, only site managers at The Grange University Hospital, the Royal Gwent Hospital, Nevill Hall Hospital and Ysbyty Ystrad Fawr (non-Mental Health Wards only) can sign for papers, arrange transfer paperwork or complete any paperwork relating to these sections.

Previously, there were a number of people who signed for these papers, but by centralising and firming up the system, it is hoped that any issues will be reduced and ultimately eradicated. By signing, you are accepting the papers on behalf of the organisation and agree to keep the patient safe, which is why this has now been formalised under the site teams.

Ward staff at the above listed Hospitals, including Nursing, MDT and medical, must now contact the site team, who will sign for the papers and make sure the mental health team fulfil any requirements under the legislation. It is important that the site team are called **before** the mental health team leave.

If these vital funds didn't have to be spent on repairs, they could be re-invested into employing more nurses to care for patients. Please help us to ensure that our patients get the best possible hospital experience we can provide by looking after our lifts.
