# Have you had your Flu Vaccination?

This winter, protecting your health and the health of those around you is more important than ever and getting your flu vaccine will be a key part of that. Influenza (flu) can be very serious. Getting your free vaccine each year is one of the best ways to protect yourself against catching and spreading flu.

Since the Staff Flu Vaccination Programme launched in September, nearly 6,000 health board staff have been vaccinated to protect themselves, their families and those they care for, from flu.

If you have not managed to have your flu vaccination yet, we urge you to get vaccinated as soon as possible before the flu virus starts to circulate.

You can receive your flu vaccination from a Flu Champion or by getting in touch with your Divisional Flu Lead. Occupational Health are also running a number of drop-in clinics, the next ones are at the Occupational Health Department at Ysbyty Ystrad Fawr on Friday 26th November and Tuesday 30th November 9:30am – 11:30am.

If you have received your flu vaccination elsewhere - such as your GP surgery or pharmacy. Please complete this short 'Had Elsewhere' form by following this link. We hope that you look after yourself and stay well throughout the winter.

#### **Work With Us Roadshow**

We are still out and about on a tour around the Health Board area to recruit new members of staff and to ensure local residents know where they should go when they need health care.

To date 151 people have submitted expressions of interest for jobs, and we have discussed provision and use of healthcare services with over 450 members of the public, who have shared some fantastic feedback about the care they or their family members have received.

#### **Launch of MECS**

Older Adult Mental Health (OAMH) services are piloting a centralised Dementia Care Mapping, Education and Carers Service (MECS). Initially the pilot will run for 6 months until 31st March 2022.

There are clear strategic aims linked to the Dementia Standards (2018-2022). The main aims within the team are to promote person centred care across the Health Board and education for staff and carers for people living with dementia.

Dementia Care Mapping (DCM) is an established approach for embedding person-centred care for people living with dementia. It prepares staff to take the perspective of the person with dementia in assessing the quality of the care they provide. It empowers staff to engage in evidence-based critical reflection in order to improve the quality of care for people living with dementia. Dementia Care Mapping will take place within the inpatient assessment wards and care homes across Gwent during the pilot.

Over the duration of the pilot, the team aim to run both face-to-face and online carers educational courses. In addition, the team will be offering training and education to staff across OAMH teams within the Health Board, focusing on person-centred care.

The core team consists of four band 6 practitioners, administration and team lead. The team is based in Ty Siriol Unit. You can email the team here:

# New Bilingual Card Game Designed by Person Centred Care Team Helps Patients and Welsh Learners

The Health Board's Person Centred Care Team, in collaboration with the Welsh Language Unit and local Welsh medium schools, have designed and created a **brand new bilingual card game**, named *Casglu* (Welsh for *To collect*).

The game was made possible by funding from the RCN Foundation and the Welsh



Language Unit and is suitable for all ages, with the aim being for players to collect as many sets of cards as possible. Children in Welsh Medium education in the Torfaen and Newport areas played a big part in designing the game's pictures and sentences.

The game was recently piloted with patients, Serenity and Caleb, on the Children's Unit at The Grange

University Hospital, who enjoyed playing with their families.

In the first instance, *Casglu* will also be made available to:

- The Children's Unit at The Grange University Hospital
- Staff who are learning / fluent in Welsh to aid with Welsh language communication skills.
- Health Board volunteers to help them support patients with meaningful activities
- Local children who helped design the game, as well as other schools in the Health Board area.



Once restrictions allow, it will also be part of the resources available for Intergenerational Activity in Care Homes and Community Wards.

We look forward to seeing the game played across our communities and generations, bringing a little bit of joy and enhancing the use of the Welsh language.
